The Government funded Legal Aid Agency provides various advice schemes for both civil and Criminal cases.</p>	<p>Identify and explain the various advice schemes that are available for both criminal and civil cases.</p>

W2/2	<p>Anyone who can afford it can pay for legal representation to deal with their matter. Lawyers are widely available and some specialise in certain types of types of work – however, the more unusual the case, the wider distance may have to be travelled to find a lawyer who is able to support the legal issue. Use of lawyers can be expensive – perhaps as much as £600 per hour, particularly for those in central London.</p>	<p>Identify and explain what other ways are there to fund a court case?</p>
W2/3	<p>As well as the Government funded advice services, there are a number of other advice scheme. These only usually deal with civil matters. Some of them are by telephone or on a website. Others, provide face-to-face advice.
