### **Duke of Edinburgh's Award.**

The 2022-2023 academic year marks 10 years of the Duke of Edinburgh's award at The Appleton School. In that time we have had 275 students complete either a Bronze, Silver or Gold Award.

We have had a fantastic uptake in Year 10 with over 40 students starting their Bronze DofE journey and 17 Year 11 students starting their Silver journey. We have also started to offer the DofE award to the Sixth form within the enrichment period.

After christmas we shall be meeting on a Thursday in the Resource Centre once a fortnight (week A) to upload evidence of all of the different activities that the students are working on.

### **Duke of Edinburgh Presentation Evening**

Dr Hunt has now received the Bronze and Silver certificates for the current Year 11 and 12 students and will be organising an Awards Evening in January. Further details will be sent out soon to all of those that have completed their full Bronze and Silver awards.

This year we have so far had 34 students achieve the Bronze Award and 3 Silver Awards.

#### **SAFEGUARDING - CAPE**

We believe that promoting the health and well-being of our pupils is an important part of their overall education. We do this through our Citizenship and Personal Excellence (CAPE) course. This looks at many topics including all kinds of relationships, physical health, emotional health, abuse, safeguarding and living in the wider world. The aim of the CAPE course is to help our pupils make safe and informed decisions during their school years and beyond.

Sex and Relationship Education (SRE) is an important part of the CAPE course. We have been teaching lessons about SRE throughout the year and has included topics such as (puberty; relationships and communication skills; pregnancy; contraceptives; prevention of HIV/AIDS and other sexually transmitted diseases; prevention of sexual abuse; FGM; body image; sexting and social media; pornography; gender inequality and consent.). The aim of the course is to educate our students in making the right choices.

As part of our commitment to this very important part of the curriculum, we will be continuing to enhance the learning of our students through external agencies and relevant staff in school presenting on some of these topics through assemblies. We will be looking to invite other providers in the future as part of our on-going commitment to this important element of a child's education.

Since September we have been providing parents/students with important online safety tips from National Online Safety. We have also recently sent all parents the first copy of our Safeguarding Newsletter, which focused on national issues with social media this term.

#### **HOMEWORK CLUB**

Homework is an integral part of education at The Appleton School as it allows students to extend their learning and to develop independent skills. We set homework frequently for all year groups, and monitor the standard to which it is completed.

In order to provide support to our students who are unable to complete the homework, either because they need further support or do not have access to the technology, Homework Club has been provided in the Resource centre every Monday and Thursday after school from 2.45 pm to 3.30 pm.

Resource centre is also available to your child during mornings from 8.00 am to 8.30 am, as well as break time and lunch times (except on Wednesday). A range of clubs are available to students before school, during lunch time and after school, which they can join by registering on Edu link on their phone.

# **EXAMINATION RESULTS 2022**

I wrote to Parents/Carers in September regarding student exam performance in the Summer term, but wanted to include the updated Year 13 information in this first edition of the Headteacher's Bulletin for this academic year.

In terms of our Sixth Form our Applied General Results were once more amongst the top 10% in the country, with an average grade of Distinction+. Our latest figures show 45 students in our Sixth Form applied to University and 42 were successful in gaining their top University places and this number continues to grow, with 22% securing places at Russell Group Universities. A further 49 students went directly into further training, employment or gained apprenticeships, including accountancy, project and programme management and engineering.

The highest performers were Natasha Cooper who gained A\* grades in three of her subjects; English, Psychology and Sociology as well as an A grade in History and gained a place at Queen Mary University of London to study Law, Reece Howard who gained A\* grades in Physics, Maths and Further Maths, Loren Pardoe who gained A\* in Psychology and Sociology and an A in English Language, Ioana Gordea who gained an A\* in Business, two A grades in German and Psychology and a grade B in English and is going on to study Management at the University of St Andrews, Alastair Munday achieved three A\* grades in Business, Law and Psychology and is going on to study Anthropology at Durham University and Samuel Jessen who gained an A\* grade in Psychology and two A grades in Sociology and Government and Politics and gained a place at Law at Swansea University.

The highest performing BTEC students were Oliver Whittaker who gained 3 Distinction stars in BTEC Business Extended Diploma and Amy Rose and Amie Waller who both achieved Distinction\* Distinction in their BTEC Sport Extended Diploma. We had students entering university this year to study Law, Economics, Anthropology, Psychology, English Literature, Robotics, Chemistry and Zoology to name just a few courses. Well done to all our Sixth Form students. We wish them well with the next stage in their careers.
