

### **PHSE**

Parents and Carers,

As a part of your child's education at The Appleton School, we promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education programme. PSHE education is the curriculum subject that gives young people the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and practical skills to live safe, healthy, productive lives and meet their full potential. At our school, this is predominantly taught in CAPE (Citizenship, Achieving Personal Excellence) through a specialised team of tutors.

I am writing to let you know that, throughout the academic year, your child's class will have taken part in lessons which will focus on the relationships and sex education (RSE) aspect of this programme. RSE lessons will include: Healthy relationships, including friendships and intimate relationships; families; growing and changing, including puberty; personal hygiene; changing feelings; becoming more independent; keeping safe and consent; developing self-esteem and confidence. This will be approached in and with age-appropriate delivery. Pupils will also have opportunities to ask questions that help prepare them for relationships of all kinds in the modern world.

PSHE education is taught throughout the school in every year group and is monitored and reviewed regularly by the staff and governing body. All PSHE teaching takes place will take place in a safe learning environment and is underpinned by our school ethos and values.

We will also be shortly inviting all parents to further support us by completing a questionnaire about our CAPE provision.

### **Mental Health December 2023**



As part of our ongoing goals to promote and support student mental health and wellbeing, we would like to highlight some recent updates made to the MindCare@Appleton website which students can access <a href="here">here</a>.

- I. Updates to the positivity hub:
  - ⇒ New <u>positive habits</u> for December to help students develop a positive mindset for the new year, such as how to make achieving new year's resolutions more likely.
  - ⇒ Research suggests that writing down our goals and making a list of actions that will help us achieve these goals increases the likelihood of us achieving them.
  - ⇒ We will be reflecting on these goals in form time, but it can also be a useful task to complete over the holidays.

### 2. Key contacts:

⇒ Students can collect Wellbeing Support cards which provide them with a physical copy of key contacts (both in and out of school). These can be collected from the pastoral office.

### 3. Updates to clubs and other activities:

⇒ Weekly-drop in sessions every Monday lunchtime in II (Drama room). Students can drop-in to speak with our Mental Health Lead and School Counsellor if they have any concerns about their wellbeing. This might include how to deal with exam stress, cope with feelings of worry or loneliness, and improve sleep quality etc. We will provide students with strategies to improve their wellbeing, and signpost them to further support in and out of school on a needs-basis.


#### 4. Additional resources:




